Tuesday, November 1: All Saints Day

Holy Day of Obligation

Let us rejoice in all the men and women, blest in the eyes of the Lord, who celebrate the heavenly liturgy. They stand in God's holy place and sing of the love the Father has bestowed upon them through the blood of the Lamb.

First mentioned in the 4th century Eastern feast of All Martyrs and attested to by St. Ephrem of Edessa († 373), this feast came to be celebrated on other days as well in the East, e.g. Easter Friday, and the Sunday after Pentecost, the day of its observance in some places in the West. In 609 or 610, the Roman Pantheon was dedicated on May 13th under the title *St. Maria and Martyrs*. Many see in this the origin of All Saints Day. For reasons which are unclear, Pope Gregory IV (827-844) transferred the feast from May to November 1st, adopting perhaps the English-Gallican practice dating from the first quarter of the 8th century.

Wednesday, November 2: All Souls' Day

Rooted in ancient Christian tradition (2nd century and Tertullian), St. Odilo of Cluny established a memorial of all the faithful departed in 988. It was accepted in Rome in the 13th century.

Thursday, November 3: St. Martin de Porres

Martin born in Lima, Peru of a Spanish father and a African slave mother. He was an Order of Preachers lay brother who humbly ministered to the poor and the sick, especially African slaves. He was devoted to the Holy Eucharist and a close friend of St. Rose of Lima. He is the patron of social justice and of peoples of mixed races. He died in 1639.

Friday, November 4: St. Charles Borromeo

Charles was a cardinal and secretary of state at the young age of 22 for his uncle, Pope Pius IV. He implemented reforms of Trent in his diocese of Milan. He is the founder of seminaries. Considered a model pastor by many bishops, including St. Francis de Sales, he held five provincial councils and eleven diocesan synods. He is the patron of catechists and of catechumens. He died November 3, 1584 at the age of 46.

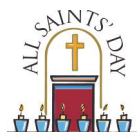

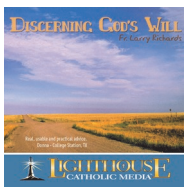
Volunteers Needed for Mobile Food Pantry

The Mobile Food Pantry is in need of plastic shopping bags. You may drop them off at either church or the parish office during business hours.

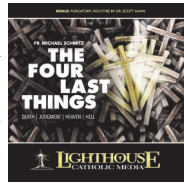

Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA

Next week our parishes will take up the Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS). The AMS relies solely on private donors in support of its mission, "Serving those who serve" and its ministry to provide the same pastoral care and services to Catholics serving in the United States Armed Forces, enrolled in U.S. Military Academies, undergoing treatment at any of the 153 Department of Veterans Affairs' Medical Centers, working in civilian jobs for the federal government beyond U.S. borders, and the families of these populations, as does any other Catholic diocese. While the salaries and retirement of Catholic military chaplains are paid for by the U.S. Government, the AMS receives no funding from government or the military for its programs and services, including the Co-Sponsored Seminarian Program, which provides priests for home dioceses and for the military chaplaincy. Catholic Apologetics

The Priesthood (Sacrament of Holy Orders)

Christ is the shepherd of His flock, the Church, (John 10:16) but he conferred that role, in a subordinate way, on his Apostles and on others.
