"Padre Pio" was born Francesco Forgione in 1887 in the small Italian village of Pietrelcina. A Capuchin priest who had received the stigmata, he spent fifty years at the monastery of San Giovanni Rotondo, where he was much sought after as a spiritual advisor, confessor and intercessor. Despite such notoriety, he would often say, "I only want to be a poor friar who

prays." His life was devoted to the Eucharist and to prayer. He died September 23, 1968 at age 81. Pope John Paul II announced the inclusion of his Memorial in the General Roman Calendar in June, 2002. He is considered the patron saint of civil defense volunteers and Catholic adolescents.

Summer Series: The Lord's Prayer Explained

by St. Thomas Aquinas

Our Father, who art in Heaven, hallowed be Thy name. Thy kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. Amen.

But deliver us from evil (Seventh Petition)

In the foregoing petitions, our Lord teaches us to seek forgiveness of our sins and how we may avoid temptations. In this petition He bids us pray to be safeguarded from evils. This is a general petition against all evils (namely, sins, sickness and afflictions, as St. Augustine says). Seeing, however, that mention has already been made of sin and temptation, it remains for other evils to be mentioned (namely, the trials and afflictions of this world), from which God delivers us in four ways:

A. God prevents evils

God prevents the occurrence of evils, but He does not do this often, since the saints are afflicted in this world and since "everyone who would live piously in Christ Jesus shall suffer persecution." (2 Timothy 3:12) Yet sometimes God does prevent a man from being afflicted by an evil—namely, when He knows him to be unable to bear it (just as a physician does not apply violent remedies to a weak patient): "Behold I have set before you an open door, and no man can shut it, for you have little strength." (Revelation 3:8) In Heaven, however, this will apply to all, seeing that there none will be afflicted: "He shall deliver you in six troubles" (those, that is, of the present life, which is divided into six stages) "and in the seventh, evil shall not touch you." (Job 5:19) "They shall hunger no more, neither thirst any more." (Revelation 7:16)

B. God comforts the suffering

He delivers us from afflictions when He comforts us in them. For unless He comforts us, we cannot endure: "We were utterly weighed down beyond our strength." (2 Corinthians 1:8) "God who comforts the humble, comforts us." (2 Corinthians 7:6) "According to the multitude of my sorrows in my heart, Your comforts delight my soul." (Psalm 94:19)

C. God rewards the afflicted

He bestows so many blessings on those who are afflicted that their evils are forgotten: "After the storm You make it calm." (Tobit 3:22) Hence such afflictions and trials are not to be feared, since they are easy to bear both on account of the attendant consolations and because of their short duration: "Our present light affliction ever more and more abundantly works out for us an eternal weight of glory," (2 Corinthians 4:17) because by means thereof we obtain eternal life.

D. God strengthens men through trials

He delivers us from evil insofar as temptations and trials are conducive to our profit. Thus he does not say, *Deliver us from trials*, but *from evil*, because trials bring the saints a crown, and for that reason they glory in their trials. Thus the Apostle says, "And not only so, but we exult in our tribulations also, knowing that tribulation works patience." (Roman 5:3) In time of tribulation You forgive sins." (Tobit 3:13) Thus God delivers man from evil and from trials by turning them to man's profit, which is a sign of very great wisdom, because it is a mark of wisdom to direct evil to a good purpose (and this is the result of patience in bearing trials.) other virtues indeed employ good things, but patience profits by evil things, which is why it is necessary only in evils, i.e., in adversity: "The learning of a man is known by his patience." (Proverbs 19:11) hence the Holy Spirit by means of the gift of wisdom makes us pray this way, so that we may obtain the beatitude which is the reward of peace. For by patience we obtain peace whether times be good or evil. For this reason, peacemakers are called the children of God because they are like God: just as nothing can hurt God, so nothing can harm them, whether they prosper or suffer. Therefore, "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called the children of God." (Matthew 5:9)

Amen.
