Scam Update & Action Steps

Scammers are continuing to impersonate priests in the Diocese of Grand Rapids through email, text or Facebook messenger, asking parishioners to respond to urgent requests for cash or to purchase gift cards. Don't fall for it. Your pastor or associate pastor will never contact a parishioner directly with an emergency request for cash or gift cards. Messages asking parishioners to help fulfill a need would come through the parish's or the diocese's official communication channels or be accomplished through a collection approved by the diocese. If you're not sure about a text, email or Facebook message you've received, do not engage or respond and call your parish office to notify a staff member. In addition, please note that neither your parish nor the diocese will ever sell or give away parishioners' personal information.
