REFLECTIONS FROM THE DESK OF THE DIRECTOR OF SACRED MUSIC

Fulton J. Sheen was asked the question: "Why pray?" His succinct response was brilliant: "Why breathe?" We've been discussing our parish singing the GLORIA in Latin. Now suppose somebody asked: "Why sing in a dead language like Latin?" I'm not smart enough to concoct a 2-word response like Archbishop Sheen; but I do have an answer. Classical music has a genre called Lieder: special German art songs. Suppose someone claimed to be the world's expert on Lieder, yet couldn't speak a single word of German. Wouldn't that be bizarre? We at Saint Mary's are all Latin Catholics. (That's because very few Catholics living in the United States belong to Eastern-Rite churches, although 23 of those are in union with Rome.) Our heritage is that of the great Western saints: Saint Francis of Assisi; Saint Thomas Aquinas; Saint Catherine of Siena; Saint Teresa of Avila; Saint Joan of Arc; Saint John of the Cross; Saint Vincent de Paul; Pope Saint Pius X; Saint Ignatius of Loyola; Saint Thérèse of Lisieux; Saint Hyacinth of Poland; Saint John Bosco; Padre Pio; Saint Bonaventure; Mother Theresa of Calcutta; Saint John de Brébeuf; Saint René Goupil; Saint Maximilian Kolbe; Saint Isaac Jogues; Saint John Mary Vianney; and so forth.

This is our heritage; we are Latin Catholics. Someone might object: "God could easily create another 10,000 universes and ten trillion more languages. God doesn't need Latin." And that's certainly true. But it's also true that Christ chose to be born in a particular place. Our Savior chose particular men (including that weakling, Peter, and that traitor, Judas Iscariot.) And the great saints—or at least a huge percentage of them—were Latin Catholics who sanctified themselves by means of the Seven Sacraments. And most of the Doctors of the Church were Latin Catholics (although not all were). It's inappropriate to focus on what God *might have* done. The true Christian has but one prayer: "Lord, do with me what Thou wilt."

Just as it would be bizarre for an expert in German *Lieder* not to know a single word in German, it would be equally bizarre for us to be ignorant of the most basic Latin prayers. It isn't necessary to become an eminent Latin scholar such as Antonio Cardinal Bacci (d. 1971) or Monsignor Ronald Knox (d. 1957)—but we should know our basic prayers in Latin. The good news is, once we learn that *sanctus* means "holy," we don't need to keep learning it over and over again. Once we know that *Agnus Dei* means "Lamb of God," we don't need to keep learning it over and over again. And so on.

On 4 December 1963, the most recent ecumenical council of the Catholic Church solemnly declared as follows:

"Steps should be taken so that the faithful may also be able to say or to sing together in Latin those parts of the Ordinary of the Mass which pertain to them."

Over the last sixty years, for one reason or another, many churches have neglected this injunction. But, surely with all the advantages we have living in this rich country, with all the modern conveniences and "time-saving" technology we have—surely we can learn our basic prayers in Latin.

EVANGELIZATION CLIP BY DEACON JIM SCHILTZ

The greatest act of Jesus' Divine Mercy is His Passion and Sacrificial Death on the Cross. THAT is our RESCUE. The entire Bible is divided into two parts. First is Genesis chapters 1 to 3. God creating us holy, in His image and likeness. But humanity falls into sin. The gates of Heaven were closed! Genesis 3:24 tells us, "God expelled the man (from Paradise), stationing the cherubim and the fiery revolving sword east of the garden of Eden." The rest of the Bible, Genesis 4 through Revelation, is about how God Rescued us from sin and damnation. The icon, The Trinity, shows God the Father, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit seated around a table. After the rebellion of Adam and Eve in the Garden, the Father asks Jesus and the Holy Spirit, "Who will go and rescue Adam and Eve?" Jesus says, "I will." The Holy Spirit's head is bowed down. He knows what it will cost the Son to do this: His mortal life. Jesus Rescued us. So pass it on.

El mayor acto de la Divina Misericordia de Jesús es Su Pasión y Muerte Sacrificial en la Cruz. ESO es nuestro RESCATE. La Biblia entera se divide en dos partes. Primero, Génesis, capítulos 1 al 3. Dios nos creó santos, a su imagen y semejanza. Pero la humanidad cae en el pecado. ¡Las puertas del Cielo se cerraron! Génesis 3:24 nos dice: «Dios expulsó al hombre (del Paraíso), colocando los querubines y la espada de fuego giratoria al este del jardín del Edén». El resto de la Biblia, desde Génesis 4 hasta Apocalipsis, trata sobre cómo Dios nos rescató del pecado y la condenación. El ícono, La Trinidad, muestra a Dios Padre, Jesús y el Espíritu Santo sentados alrededor de una mesa. Tras la rebelión de Adán y Eva en el Jardín, el Padre pregunta a Jesús y al Espíritu Santo: «¿Quién irá a rescatar a Adán y a Eva?». Jesús responde: «Yo iré». El Espíritu Santo inclina la cabeza. Él sabe lo que le costará al Hijo hacer esto: su vida mortal. Jesús nos rescató. Así que compártelo.
