# REFLECTIONS FROM THE DESK OF THE DIRECTOR OF SACRED MUSIC: POPE LEO XIV ON POLYPHONY

In June of 2025, Pope Leo XIV gave a speech about sacred polyphony, saying: "Polyphony itself, moreover, is a musical form full of meaning, for prayer and for Christian life. First of all, in fact, it is inspired by the Sacred Text, which it aims to "clothe with appropriate melody" (*Inter pastoralis officii*) so that it can better reach "the intelligence of the faithful" (ibid.). Furthermore, it achieves this goal by entrusting the words to several voices, each of which repeats them in its own and original way, with varied and complementary melodic and harmonic movements. Finally, it harmonizes everything thanks to the skill with which the composer develops and intertwines the melodies, respecting the rules of counterpoint, making them echo each other, sometimes even creating dissonances, which then find resolution in new chords."

### EVANGELIZATION CLIP BY DEACON JIM SCHILTZ

We celebrate the solemnity of two principal pillars of the Catholic Church, Saint Peter and Saint Paul. Peter, a fisherman by trade, born in Bethsaida, a fishing town on the Sea of Galilee, uneducated, evangelized the Jewish people. Paul, a tentmaker by trade, born in Tarsus (now in Turkey), highly educated and a Roman citizen, evangelized gentiles (non-Jewish people). Peter and Paul had in common their focus on Jesus as Lord and Savior and their unrelenting drive to evangelize. Those two traits are a driving force in our lives as disciples. We hear today Jesus asking His disciples—that includes us—"Who do YOU say that I am?" If, like Peter and Paul, we believe that Jesus is our Lord and Savior, then we will evangelize also and pass on our faith. To do that, we have no need to travel the world, like Peter and Paul did. We just have to speak across our family dinner table. So, who do YOU say that Jesus is?" Who do you lead to Jesus?

Celebramos la solemnidad de dos pilares fundamentales de la Iglesia Católica: San Pedro y San Pablo. Pedro, pescador de profesión, nacido en Betsaida, un pueblo pesquero a orillas del Mar de Galilea, sin estudios, vangelizó al pueblo judío. Pablo, fabricante de tiendas de profesión, nacido en Tarso (actualmente en Turquía), con una educación superior y ciudadano romano, evangelizó a los gentiles (no judíos). Pedro y Pablo compartían su enfoque en Jesús como Señor y Salvador y su incansable ímpetu por evangelizar. Estos dos rasgos son un motor en nuestra vida como discípulos. Hoy escuchamos a Jesús preguntar a sus discípulos, incluyéndonos a nosotros: "Y ustedes, ¿Quién dicen que soy yo?". Si, como Pedro y Pablo, creemos que Jesús es nuestro Señor y Salvador, entonces también evangelizaremos y transmitiremos nuestra fe. Para ello, no necesitamos viajar por el mundo, como lo hicieron Pedro y Pablo. Basta con hablar en la mesa familiar. Entonces, ¿quién dice usted que es Jesús?". ¿A quién lleva a Jesús?
